#### Meeting Minutes

- **1. Call to Order:** Vice Chair Mayor Marion Grayson called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. and stated that a quorum was present.
- 2. Opportunity for Public Comments: No comments were made by the public.
- 3. Staff Update: KTMPO staff provided the following updates.
- --Cheryl Maxwell stated that KTMPO published their summer edition of the newsletter. Ms. Maxwell stated that each edition will feature a city in the MPO and this edition featured Killeen.

- --Jason Deckman provided an update on the Congestion Management Process. Mr. Deckman stated that Alliance Transportation Group Inc. provided a new tool that would be presented to the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) at July's meeting. This tool may be used to prioritize and rank congested areas in the KTMPO based on weighted criteria that can be adjusted.
- --Jim Martin stated that 10 members have signed up as part of the Freight Advisory Committee, but they need more members from private industries to be part of this committee. The first meeting is tentatively set for mid-July.
- --John Weber stated that the next Bicycle/Pedestrian Advisory Committee meeting will be held on July 12<sup>th</sup>, 2016 at 9:00 a.m.
- --Mr. Weber also provided an update on air quality readings. May's ozone readings were 58 ppb at the Temple station and 57 ppb at the Killeen station. The current design value at each station is 66 ppb at the Temple station and 65 ppb at the Killeen station, both below the 70 ppb ozone standard.
- 4. Action Item: Regarding approval of minutes from May 18, 2016 TPPB meeting.

Carole Warlick made a motion to approve May 18, 2016 TPPB meeting minutes, seconded by Councilmember Tim Davis; the motion passed unanimously.

5. Action Item: Regarding approval of the 2017-2020 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).

Cheryl Maxwell stated that a public comment period was held from April 23- May 22, 2016 with two public hearings held on May 2, 2016. KTMPO received one comment in support of the TIP. At the June 1, 2016 TAC meeting, TAC recommended approval of the FY 2017-2020 TIP.

Councilmember Tim Davis made a motion to approve the 2017-2020 Transportation Improvement Program, Andrea Gardner seconded the motion; the motion passed unanimously.

- 6. Action Item: Regarding amendments to the 2040 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) as follows:
  - a) initiation of the Public Involvement Process to add the Belton Loop 121 project from FM 436 to IH 35.
  - b) Administrative amendments to change extents for US 190 projects MPO ID W40-02, W30-28 and W30-29.

Cheryl Maxwell stated that Belton Loop 121 widening project is broken into three sections but the section from IH 35 to FM 436 (MPO ID W40-04) is not currently in the MTP. This amendment requires the MPO to go through the Public Involvement Process.

The second amendment is administrative. The extent for US 190 from one mile west of FM 2410 to IH-35 will not change but instead of three segments for this section, four are now proposed. Amendments are needed to adjust the actual project extents for W40-02, W30-28, and W30-29 and to add W40-05 as a new section of US 190.

Ms. Maxwell stated, that the 15 day public comment period will start on June 25 and end on July 9, 2016 with a public hearing on June 27, 2016 at 5:00 p.m. at the CTCOG building. Final approval by the TPPB is anticipated on July 20, 2016.

Councilmember Juan Rivera made a motion to initiate the Public Involvement Process, seconded by Andrea Gardner; the motion passed unanimously.

- 7. Action Item: Regarding reprioritization of projects in the 2040 MTP as follows:
  - a) approval of project selection process and scoring criteria;
  - b) set fiscal constrain for transit projects.

Cheryl Maxwell stated that KTMPO has contracted with CDM Smith, Inc. to assist in developing a project selection process and scoring criteria to reprioritize and update the project listing in the 2040 MTP. The scoring criteria has two scoring tracks, one for roadway projects and one for livability projects (bike/pedestrian). Ms. Maxwell explained the scoring criteria and points awarded for each noting that the objective criteria will be scored by KTMPO staff while the TAC members will score the subjective criteria.

For fiscal constraints, KTMPO staff does not propose to revise fiscal constraints at this time and will use the same figures identified in the 2040 MTP. However, staff requested guidance from the board regarding fiscal constraint for the transit projects. In the past, TPPB has voted to dedicate 10% of Category 7 funds for transit projects when the projects were selected for funding. Staff proposed the board officially dedicate 10% of the Category 7 funding for a set number of fiscal years so there would be more certainty for planning future transit projects. The board discussed the pros and cons of dedicating funding for future years.

Chair Scott Cosper arrived during the discussion of this item and presided over the rest of the meeting.

Andrea Gardner made a motion to approve the project selection process and scoring criteria and to consider the 10% dedication for transit projects on a yearly basis as funding becomes available and projects are selected, seconded by Councilmember Juan Rivera; the motion passed unanimously.

**8. Action Item:** Regarding support of request to TxDOT to conduct a feasibility study on IH-14 future alignment east of IH-35.

Cheryl Maxwell stated that KTMPO participated in a joint meeting with stakeholders regarding the eastern alignment of the future IH-14. Participants looked at several potential routes to connect current US 190 where it meets IH-35 to US 190 in eastern Bell County. It was determined that a feasibility study is needed to assess proposed routes and develop a recommendation. KTMPO proposes to submit an official request to TxDOT to conduct this study. At the June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2016 TAC meeting, TAC recommended approval to support the request.

Michael Bolin mentioned that an AASHTO (American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials) committee (Special Committee on US Route Numbering) denied a request to name the section of US 190 from Copperas Cove to IH-35 as IH-14. Therefore, the name "IH-14" is under review at this time.

Vice Chair Mayor Marion Grayson made a motion to support the request to TxDOT to conduct a feasibility study on IH-14 future alignment east of IH-35, seconded by Andrea Gardner; the motion passed unanimously.

**9. Action Item:** Regarding support for the Vulnerable Road User Ordinance proposed by the Bicycle/Pedestrian Advisory Committee.

Cheryl Maxwell stated that at May 10<sup>th</sup>, 2016 BPAC meeting, BPAC members made a recommendation to approve the Vulnerable Road User Ordinance. The purpose of this ordinance is to protect vulnerable road users who may occupy a portion of the roadway. To provide the highest amount of safety between vulnerable road users and vehicles, a three foot buffer is desired. This ordinance serves as a template for cities in the KTMPO region to adopt a similar ordinance. At the June 1<sup>st</sup> TAC meeting, TAC recommended approval to support the Vulnerable Road User Ordinance.

Councilmember Tim Davis made a motion to support the Vulnerable Road User Ordinance & distribute to cities within the KTMPO, seconded by Mayor Rob Robinson; the motion passed unanimously.

#### 10. Member Comments:

Commissioner Brown mentioned that several years ago when the two lake levels peaked, two major roadways were affected and had to be closed down. These were SH317 just north of SH36 in Temple's city limits and FM 2484 in Killeen's ETJ. With the lake levels rising these areas could again be at risk. He suggested that the cities of Temple and Killeen submit projects for the MTP project call to raise the road/bridge levels in some fashion so future flooding events will not impact travel on these roadways.

#### MTP Amendments for Belton Project

#### Amendment Summary:

The Belton Loop 121 project (widen from 2 to 4 lanes) was approved for TxDOT development funds at the previous meeting. It is broken into three project sections; however, one section is not currently in the MTP. The section being added extends from FM436 to IH35 (MPO ID 40-04). The estimated cost of this project at this time is \$5.1 million. This project will be placed in the unfunded section of the MTP to allow TxDOT to begin preliminary engineering and plan development.

#### Background:

The MTP is the 25 year long range planning document for KTMPO. The MTP includes a short and long-range prioritized project listing incorporating projects expected to be funded within the document's 25 year planning horizon. The project listing is fiscally constrained based on projected funding the MPO expects to receive in the 25 year planning period. The document also lists regionally significant unfunded projects.

#### CMP Congested Segment Prioritization Tool and Congestion Network

#### **Summary:**

KTMPO adopted a Congestion Management Process (CMP) in October 2013 that provides a framework for identifying congestion problems and possible solutions for our region. KTMPO contracted with Alliance Transportation Group to further develop and implement the CMP by collecting data, monitoring system performance, identifying congestion problems and needs, identifying and evaluating strategies, updating the CMP with a prioritized list of policies, programs, and projects, and monitoring strategy effectiveness.

As part of the CMP, a congestion network needs to be identified. It is based on available sources of traffic data as well as public input. This information is used to identify the most congested road segments and intersections in the MPO. The KTMPO Defined Network identified in the 2013 CMP will be evaluated along with other segments and corridors. A prioritization of these segments and intersections is then developed based upon weighted performance measures. Alliance has developed a tool that allows us to apply differing weights to those performance measures to best assess the congestion in the MPO.

At the July TAC meeting, Alliance presented the congested segment prioritization tool and gave instruction on how to use it. Each TAC member was then sent the spreadsheet and asked to experiment with the weights of the performance measures and provide feedback on how the criteria should be weighted. At the August TAC meeting, action was taken to recommend weighting of the criteria and the resulting final congestion network prioritization. Alliance Transportation Group presented two options: Option 1 was based on the score sheets received from TAC members and Option 2 was based on feedback from the TAC, staff, and Alliance Transportation Group (referred to as "all feedback"). The TAC recommended the following criteria and weights (Option 2 with adjustments): Congestion – 30%; Volume – 20%; Safety Crashes – 15%; Safety Rear-End - 10%; Transit – 15%; School – 5%; Public Input – 5%. The resulting prioritized congestion network is attached.

#### **Tentative Schedule:**

- August 3, 2016—TAC recommendation for a final congestion network prioritization
- August 17, 2016—TPPB approval of final congestion network prioritization
- September 14, 2016—TAC recommendation to approve Congestion Management Process and initiate Public Involvement Process
- September 21, 2016—TPPB approves Congestion Management Process and initiate Public Involvement Process
- September 24-October 8, 2016—15-day Public Comment Period
- Public Hearing—TBD
- October 5, 2016—TAC recommendation to approve Congestion Management Process, subject to any comments received
- October 19, 2016—TPPB approves Congestion Management Process



#### MTP Reprioritization Project Call

#### Summary:

Since opening the MTP project call, the question has come up regarding how to handle projects that are already in the MTP. Per the approved scoring criteria, all projects, including those currently in the MTP, must be submitted if an entity wants their project scored and ranked. In some cases, this could mean an entity will have several applications to submit. At the August TAC meeting, TAC members discussed the following scenarios:

- 1) Submit all projects now for full evaluation and scoring (currently required by the project call).
- 2) Submit top projects now for full evaluation and scoring.
  - a. Have annual project call to submit the others for evaluation/scoring and merge into list of scored/ranked projects;
  - b. Submit others after the call closes and request their placement in unfunded section as unscored projects;
  - c. Wait for 2045 MTP update in 2018/2019 to submit remaining projects for evaluation/scoring.
- 3) Amend project call now to allow designated projects to be unscored and placed in unfunded section.

Many TAC members felt that an annual project call should occur to include projects that may not seem relevant now but in a few years, may be top priority. TAC Members suggested that projects submitted before the deadline be scored and ranked and projects submitted at a future project call be scored and ranked at that time and merged with the existing list, provided the criteria has not changed. TAC members made a recommendation to extend the submission deadline two (2) weeks with considerations from staff, TAC, and TPPB. Based upon TAC's recommendation, staff has extended the deadline from August 12<sup>th</sup> to August 26, 2016. TAC members also recommended an annual call for projects with the same scoring criteria.

At the TAC meeting, there were questions regarding whether funding is related to the number of projects that are listed. Staff has discussed this with TxDOT and having a large number of projects in the MTP will not increase KTMPO's funding. The amount of funding that KTMPO receives (as well as the other MPOs in the State) is determined by a preset formula that takes into account several factors. The formula is actually under review and discussion with all the MPOs right now. Therefore, the amount of projects in the MTP does not affect how much money we receive.

However, a project being listed in the MTP could have an impact on any competitive grant or local call (our MTP reprioritization scoring criteria awards points if a project is currently in the MTP). If a project receives points for inclusion in a plan, then it can potentially impact the project selection and funding, if any, received under these types of funding opportunities.

Staff is seeking input from TPPB members on how to address the issue of MTP project submissions, specifically those projects that entities want to include, but are not an immediate priority. Staff has discussed this issue with TxDOT and recommends the following:

1) In addition to the Short Range Funded (2014 – 2023), Long Range Funded (2024 – 2040), and Regionally Significant Unfunded (RSU) listing, we add a listing for Future Anticipated Projects (Appendix A1). The RSU projects are viable projects that are scored and ranked and may move up to the Long Range Funded listing if additional funding becomes available. The Future Anticipated Projects are more conceptual projects where specific details are unknown. The projects would not be required to have a dollar value assigned to them at this point but a "Purpose and Need Statement" would be required for their submittal and consideration for inclusion in this listing. These projects would not be scored or

ranked and could not move up to the RSU list without going through the scoring process. This would confirm the need for a project that is forecasted many years out, without requiring a lot of detailed information that is basically unknown at this time, or that will change significantly in the future.

- 2) Submissions for the Future Anticipated Projects may occur at any time. Staff would present these to the TAC/TPPB for approval, and would be processed as administrative amendments; no public involvement process would be required since the overall project listing is not affected.
- 3) Issue a Call for Projects to update the MTP listing on an annual basis, provided the scoring criteria has not changed. These projects would be scored and ranked and integrated into the list with the existing projects. This would provide an opportunity for the regional needs to be evaluated more frequently and result in a more current and accurate listing. The call would only be for new projects or changes to existing projects. Projects that are currently in the MTP and are unchanged would not have to be resubmitted.

- August 29-September 7—Objective scores assigned
- September 8-21—Subjective scores assigned
- September 14—TAC meeting/Project Call workshop
- September 22-28—Scores combined and ranking established
- October 5—TAC recommend approval of ranking
- October 19—TPPB approve ranking and initiation of PIP
- October 22-November 5—Public Comment Period (15 days)
- November 2—TAC recommend approval of MTP Project Listing amendment subject to any comments received
- November 16—TPPB approve MTP Project Listing amendment
