Meeting Minutes

- 1. Call to Order:** Cheryl Maxwell called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m.
- 2. Opportunity for Public Comment:** No comments were made from the public.
- 3. Staff Update:** KTMPO staff provided the following updates:

John Weber provided an update on the Freight Advisory Committee (FAC) and the Bicycle/Pedestrian Advisory Committee (BPAC). The next FAC meeting will be on August 16th, 2017 at 11:30 a.m. and the next BPAC meeting will be on July 11, 2017 at 9:00 a.m.

Ozone readings for the month of May were 75 parts per billion (ppb) at the Temple station and 69 ppb at the Killeen station.

- 4. Action Item:** Approve minutes from June 7, 2017 meeting.

David Olson made a motion to approve June 7, 2017 meeting minutes, seconded by Joseph Molis; the motion passed unanimously.

5. Action Item: Recommendation to approve an amendment to the FY17-20 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to update limits for the Heritage Oaks Hike & Bike Trail Segment 3A (K40-23).

Cheryl Maxwell explained that an amendment to the FY 17-20 TIP is needed to change the extents on the Heritage Oaks Hike & Bike Trail Segment 3A project. The revised extent is from Nickelback Drive to Pyrite Drive. Ms. Maxwell stated that the 15 day public comment period runs from June 24 to July 8 with a public hearing held on June 27. As of the July 5, 2017, two comments were received in general support of hike and bike trails and there was no opposition to the proposed amendment.

Brian Chandler made a motion to recommend approval of the proposed amendment, seconded by David Olson; the motion passed unanimously.

John Weber provided an updated on the public input received through June 30, 2017.

7. Member Comments.

Robert Ator stated that there will be two public hearings held in August to discuss changes to the HOP routes. Revised routes will take effect on September 1st.

Erin Smith stated that new gateway signs and vehicular directional signs were installed in the City of Belton.

Summary:

Organized by the Partnership of a Walkable America, National Walk to School Day in the United States began in 1997. In 2000, the International Walk to School Day was created when the US, UK, and Canada joined together to promote walking to school. As participation in International Walk to School Day increased, the International Walk to School Committee declared the month of October as International Walk to School Month in 2006. Today, approximately 40 countries worldwide celebrate walking to school every October including 14,800 schools in the US. October 4, 2017 is also declared as International Walk to School Day.

The KTMPO Bike/Ped Advisory Committee recommended the TPPB approve a resolution supporting October 2017 as Walk to School Month and October 4, 2017 as Walk to School Day in the KTMPO region.

Performance Measures**

Targets for Safety Performance Measures

Summary:

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and Federal Transit Administration (FTA) have set the following national performance measures:

- Safety
- Pavement and Bridge Condition
- System Performance and Freight
- CMAQ (Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality) Improvement Program
- Transit Asset Management (State of Good Repair)
- Transit Agency Safety Plan

KTMPPO recently set performance targets for the Transit Asset Management State of Good Repair performance measure. The next performance measure to be considered is Safety. The MPO is required to set performance targets for Safety by February 27, 2018. We have the option of establishing our own performance targets or we can agree to support performance targets established by the state.

The TxDOT Safety Target areas are identified below:

- Total Number of Traffic Fatalities
- Total Number of Incapacitating Injuries
- Death Rate: Deaths per 100 Million Vehicle Miles Traveled
- Injury Rate: Serious Injuries per 100 Million Vehicle Miles Traveled
- Total Number of Non-Motorized Fatalities and Serious Injuries

The target for these areas is to achieve a 2% reduction from the original trend line projection in 2022. This is explained in more detail in the attached sheets along with TxDOT's calculations for fatalities and injuries statewide.

KTMPPO staff have reviewed the data sources used by TxDOT looking at the five target areas above. We've also reviewed the methodology for calculating the targets based on the desired 2% reduction and it appears that the data doesn't support forecasting localized safety trends for our region. We will present the data and charts at the meeting on Wednesday.

If an MPO does not opt to set their own safety targets but instead agrees to support a state safety target, the MPO would do the following:

- Work with the state and safety stakeholders to address areas of concern for fatalities or serious injuries within the MPO planning area;
- Coordinate with the state and include in the Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) the safety performance measures and targets for all public roads in the metropolitan area;
- Integrate into the planning process the safety goals, objectives, performance measures and targets described in other state safety transportation plans and processes such as applicable portions of the Highway Safety Implementation Plan (HSIP);
- Include a description in the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) of the anticipated effect of the TIP toward achieving HSIP targets in the MTP, linking investment priorities in the TIP to those safety targets.

Ways in which we can support the state safety targets include using past data to identify areas that have shown a concentration of accidents and continue to use crash rates as one of our scoring criteria to select projects that support the statewide goals. We can also use this information as part of our public outreach efforts to educate drivers about ways they can drive more safely and reduce accidents.

We would like to have a discussion with the TAC members on Wednesday to go over the data for our planning area and the options we have regarding the safety targets.

Subject: Safety Target Coordination with MPOs

We are providing the following information for the Transportation, Planning and Programming Division to share with the Texas Association of Metropolitan Planning Organizations (TEMPO).

We recently met with the Strategic Highway Safety Plan (SHSP) stakeholder and executive teams to discuss SHSP Safety Targets and SHSP Branding. Several MPOs were a part of these meetings. As was discussed at the Safety Target Workshop in January, the SHSP targets have to be consistent with the Highway Safety Plan (HSP) Targets and the Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) Targets. The HSP and HSIP Targets have to be identical. The MPOs also need to have input into the statewide targets and will establish specific MPO targets or choose to support the statewide targets.

The following table summarizes that timeline:

Safety Program	Target Year(s)	Establishment Date
Highway Safety Plan (HSP)	2018 and 2020	July 1, 2017
Strategic Highway Safety Plan (SHSP)	2022	August 1, 2017
Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP)	2018	August 31, 2017
Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO)	2018	February 27, 2018

The SHSP utilized a data-driven, multi-year, collaborative process to establish safety targets. The consensus of the SHSP stakeholder and executive teams is to utilize a methodology of establishing targets that would result in a 2% reduction from the original trend line projection in 2022. The proposed reduction of 2% by 2022, which only applies to positive slope projection trends, would be achieved by reducing each intermediate year by the following reduction percentages:

Year	Reduction
2017	0.0%
2018	0.4%
2019	0.8%
2020	1.2%
2021	1.6%
2022	2.0%

When the slope analysis projects a negative slope, the target set will mirror the projection determined by the slope.

Based upon that direction, draft targets were calculated for the 5 common performance measures as follows:

2018 Target: To decrease the expected rise of fatalities from 3,516 in 2015 to not more than 3,891 fatalities in 2018
