Meeting Minutes:

1. **Call to Order:** Commissioner Bobby Whiston called the meeting to order at 9:32am.
2. Opportunity for Public Comment: There were no public comments.
3. **Action Item:** Approve minutes from the May 21, 2025, meeting.

Councilmember Riakos Adams made a motion to approve the May 21, 2025, meeting minutes, seconded by Darrell Burtner; the motion passed unanimously.

4. **Discussion and Action Item:** Regarding approval of FY2026-2027 Unified Planning Work Program.

Uryan Nelson provided an update on the Draft 2026–2027 UPWP. Mr. Nelson explained that minor edits were made to the draft, but it was ready to be put up for approval.

Councilmember Riakos Adams made a motion to approve the FY2026-2027 Unified Planning Work Program, seconded by Darrell Burtner; the motion passed unanimously.

5. **Discussion Item:** Regarding update of the TxDOT-KTMPO-CTCOG 5-Year Planning Agreement.

Uryan Nelson provided an update to the Planning Agreement between TxDOT, KTMPO, and CTCOG. Mr. Nelson explained that TxDOT has extended the 2018 Planning Agreement through 2026 to allow additional time for the completion of revisions to the new agreement, and that a revised agreement was expected by late 2025.

6. **Discussion Item:** Regarding TxDOT Quarterly Project Status Updates.

TxDOT Belton Area Engineer, Michael Yates, P.E., provided an update on major projects across the region.

7. **Discussion Item:** Regarding TIP/MTP Programmed Funding and Project Readiness.

Uryan Nelson provided an update regarding recent discussions with TxDOT about program carryover funding. Mr. Nelson emphasized the importance of expending the MPO's CAT 7 funds in a timely manner. Mr. Nelson reminded the TPPB of the legislative rule change that took effect in October 2024, which allows TxDOT to transfer unspent CAT 7 carryover funds – above 200% of the MPO's annual allocation – from the MPO's CAT 2 funds for redistribution to TxDOT districts. Mr. Nelson noted that KTMPO has several options for how to allocate its available funding and reported that KTMPO is currently on track to obligate all CAT 7 funds in FY 2027 and FY 2028. Mr. Nelson stated that this item will continue to be brought before TPPB to ensure projects remain on schedule and to avoid the potential loss of CAT 2 funds.

8. **Discussion Item:** Regarding Public Comment Period for Amendments to the FY25-2

Anita Janke provided an update on the FY25–28 TIP and the 2050 MTP August 2025 amendments. Ms. Janke outlined the schedule for the Public Comment Period for the August 2025 amendments, as well as the anticipated adoption timeline for the August amendments.

9. **Discussion Item:** Regarding Regional Active Transportation Plan.

Anita Janke provided an update on the Regional Active Transportation Plan, presenting mapped data to the TPPB that included the region's schools, sidewalk networks, and parks. Ms. Janke noted that additional data on regional infrastructure is still needed and outlined three potential approaches for completing sidewalk mapping: conducting the work in-house, utilizing an automated mapping program, or contracting with a consultant. Ms. Janke also informed the TPPB that KTMPO's GIS Specialist, Tay Floyd, would be reaching out to local stakeholders to collect GIS data relevant to the development of the plan's maps.

10. **Discussion Item:** Regarding SS4A Grant Update.

Uryan Nelson provided an update on the SS4A grant. KTMPO has completed all required activities and is beginning the close-out process. Mr. Nelson addressed the in-kind documentation and signatures needed for the grant and emphasized the importance of returning the DocuSign documents to staff so the in-kind can be documented.

11. **Discussion Item:** Regarding public input received through May 2025.

Anita Janke provided a summary of public comments through May of 2025.

12. **Director's Update:**

Uryan Nelson provided an update on the schedule for the upcoming KTMPO meetings. Mr. Nelson shared the maximum ozone air quality readings for May, which were 69 parts per billion (ppb) at the Temple station and 82 ppb at the Killeen station.

13. **Member Comments:**

Victor Goebel provided an update on the TxDOT UTP, noting that two Waco District projects in the KTMPO region were to be pushed back due to shifts in funding, but emphasized that they were not being defunded. David Mitchell asked if the projects being pushed back were due to funding concerns, to which Mr. Goebel said that TxDOT was pushing projects back to align with yearly spending allocations.

Commissioner Bobby Whitson expressed concern that pushing major projects in the region back could lead to difficulties with traffic, especially around the new school built in Temple. Mr. Goebel suggested that smaller projects that precluded the major roadway projects could be done in the interim.

14. Adjourn: The meeting adjourned at 10:11am.

Amendments to the FY25-28 TIP and 2050 MTP for the August STIP Revision

The Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) is a 4-year transportation planning document that includes a detailed listing of projects reasonably expected to begin within a four-year period. The current TIP covers FY25-FY28. Projects included in the TIP must be consistent with the MTP and are chosen based on regional priority and available funding. An amendment to a TIP is not completed until the change has also been included in the STIP—Statewide Transportation Improvement Program.

The Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) is the 25-year long range planning document for KTMP. The 2050 MTP includes a short and long-range prioritized project listing incorporating projects expected to be funded within the document's 25-year planning horizon. The project listing is fiscally constrained based on the projected funding the MPO expects to receive in the 25-year planning period. The document also lists regionally significant unfunded projects. Projects must be included in the funded section of the MTP in order to receive state or federal funding.

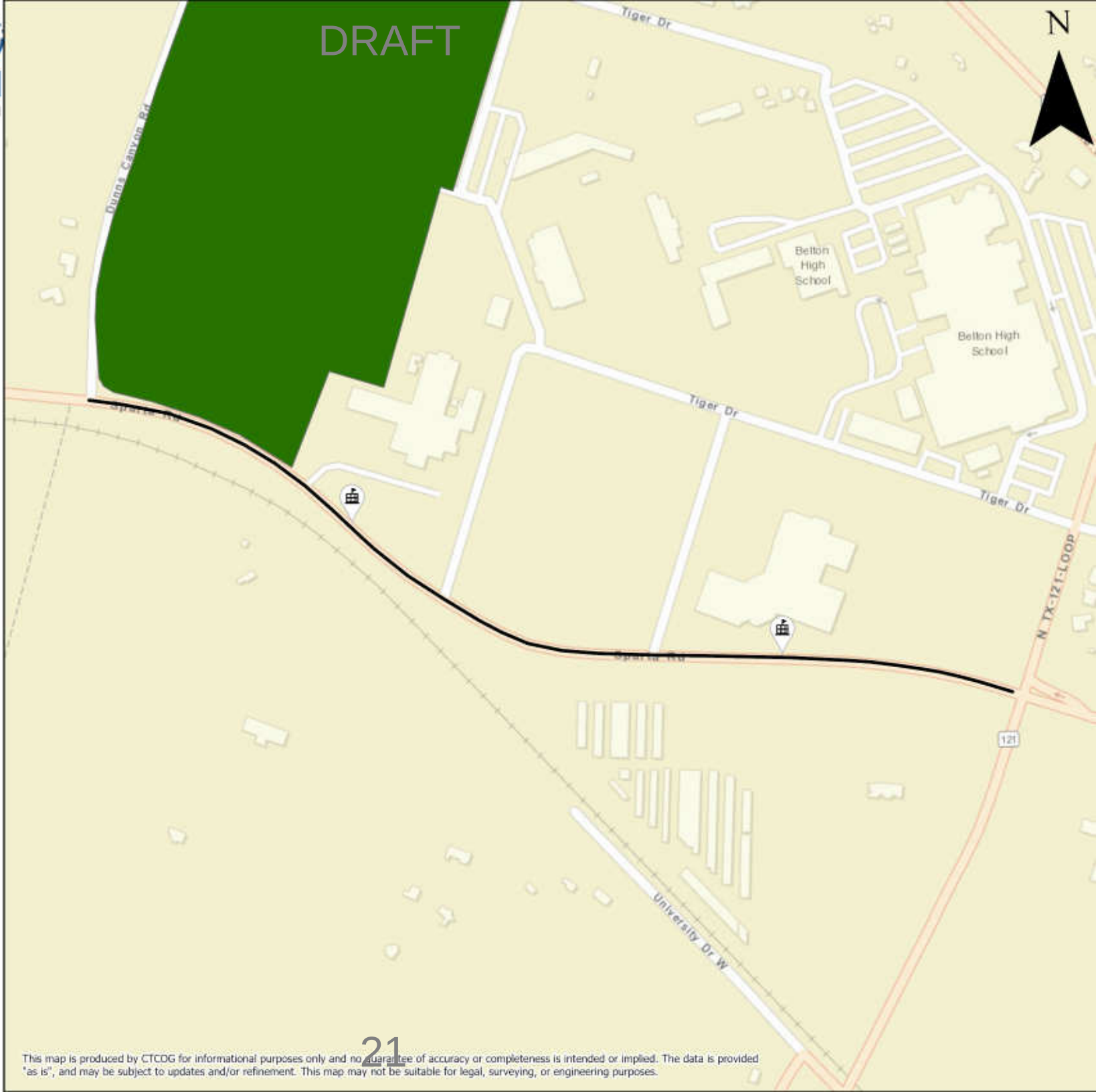

In 2012, the passing of MAP-21 (Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century) legislation allowed for federal funds to be allocated through the Surface Transportation Program for transportation needs within the boundaries of designated metropolitan planning areas (MPAs) of metropolitan planning organizations (MPOs) located in a transportation management area (TMA). These funds are referred to as “metropolitan mobility and rehabilitation” funds or STP-MM funds. TxDOT categorizes them as “Category 7” funds.

KTMPO became eligible to receive STP-MM funds in FY2012-2013 due to its 2012 designation as a TMA, as a result of Killeen’s population exceeding 200,000.

At the May 15, 2013 KTMPO Policy Board meeting, TPPB approved 10% of Category 7 funds to be designated for Transit capital projects, such as bus purchases, with the remaining 90% to be designated for Roadway projects.

Hill Country Transit District received 10% of Category 7 funds from 2014 until the most recent Federal Certification Review in 2022, when KTMPO learned that a funding set aside would no longer be allowed because a competitive scoring and ranking process was not in place for the Transit projects.

Currently, KTMPO is exploring the ability to resume the suballocation of Category 7 funds for Transit projects with a competitive scoring and ranking process in place. If allowed, Transit projects would be competitively scored against transit specific criteria and scoring methodology developed with the assistance of the TAC and approved by the TPPB.

Action Needed: Motion of direction for staff to work with TxDOT and FHWA on the ability to suballocate Category 7 funds and with TAC to develop and bring forward a mode-specific criteria and scoring methodology.

KTMPPO Regional Active Transportation Plan Update

Background

KTMPPO adopted the Regional Multimodal Plan (RMP) on September 20, 2018. The plan explored ways to adapt to evolving transportation modes by shifting the focus to a broader approach that included biking, walking, and public transit.

In 2020, The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) began the Texas Active Transportation Plan Inventory. In the Fall of 2023, TxDOT conducted a combined outreach effort for the Statewide Active Transportation Plan and the Statewide Multimodal Transit Plan. The Existing State of Active Transportation Report was made available in February 2025.

During the September 11, 2024, BPAC meeting, KTMPPO staff recommended developing a Regional Active Transportation Plan that identifies opportunities for multi-jurisdictional trail connections and to promote innovative strategies that support walking, cycling, and other forms of active transportation. The plan will focus on integrating safe routes to school, sidewalks, bike paths, transit stops, parks, and shared-use paths across the region.

Objective

- Develop a comprehensive GIS-based inventory to support the creation of a Regional Active Transportation Plan, prioritizing safety, sidewalk infrastructure around schools, and neighborhood connectivity. The inventory will identify existing infrastructure, gaps, and opportunities for walking, biking, and rolling (micromobility), with a focus on creating safe, accessible, and convenient routes for children and families.
- The Regional Active Transportation Plan will support healthier lifestyles, reduce traffic congestion near schools, and foster stronger, more connected communities.
- Utilize public engagement, TAC/PB and ATAC to prioritize desired connectivity in the development of the regional Active Transportation Plan.
- The plan demonstrates planning readiness, improves grant competitiveness, will help prioritize projects and encourages multimodal integration.

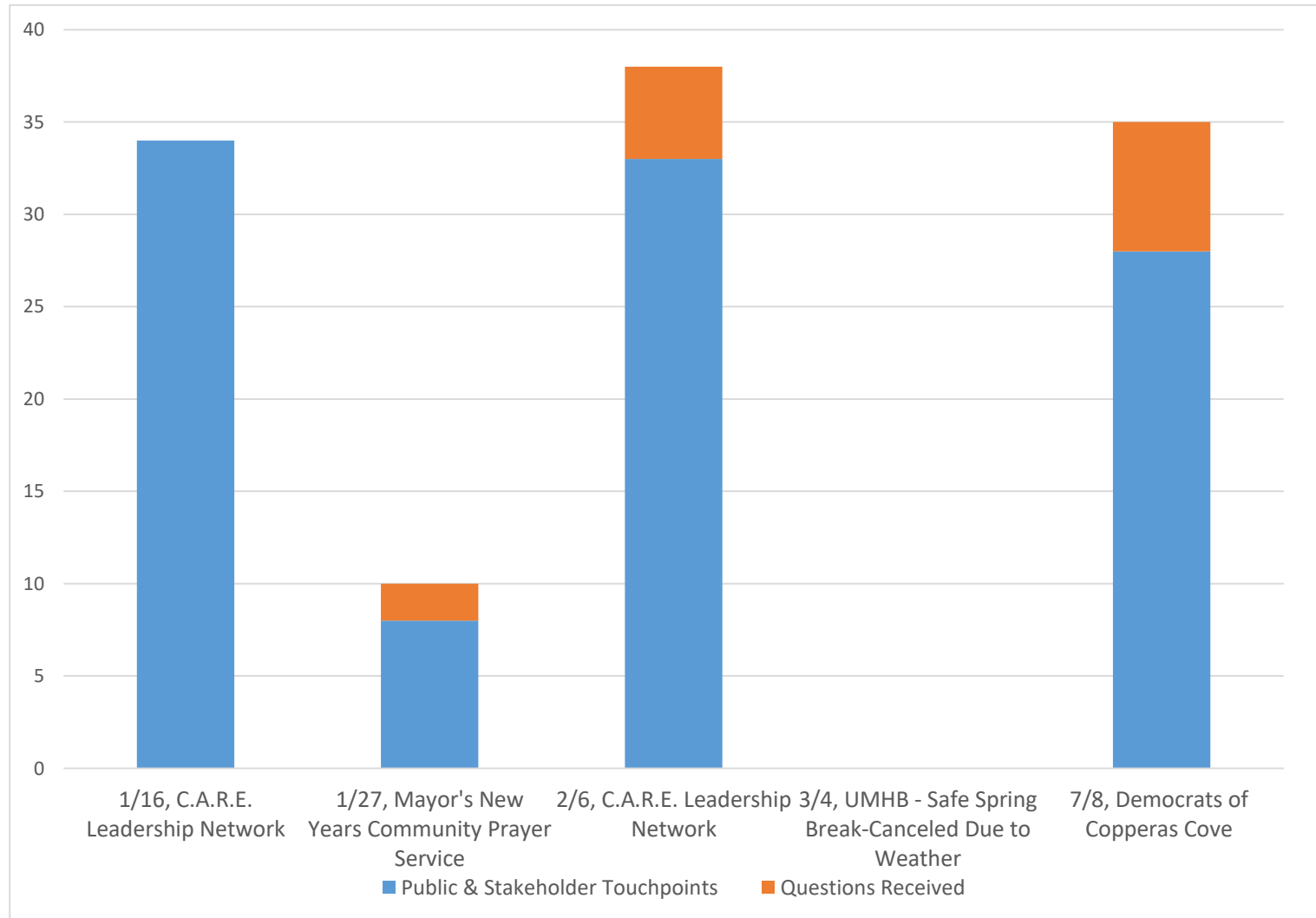

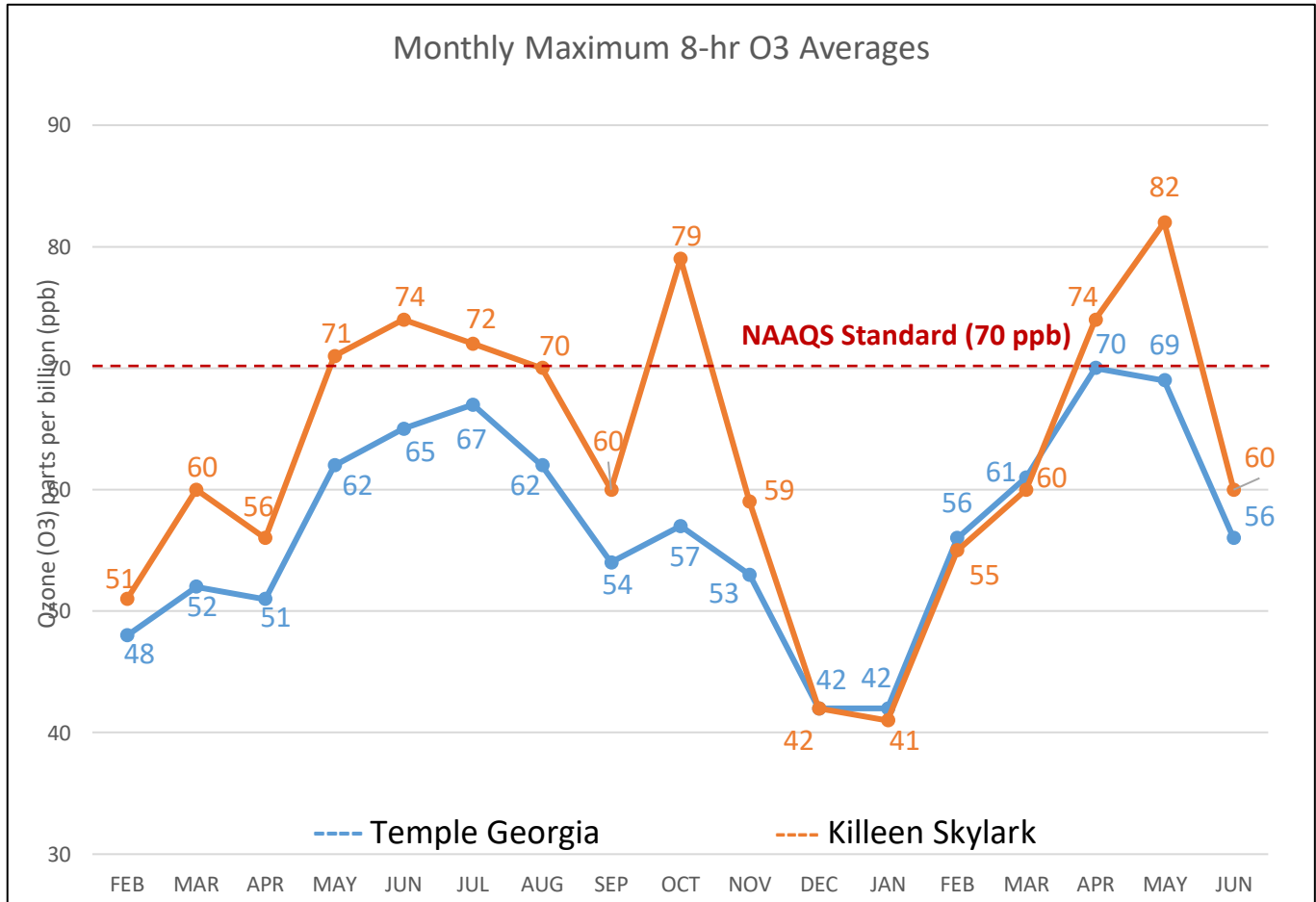
